Today we are celebrating St Alban to celebrate **St Alban's Kilmany's 'Feast of Title'** Unfortunately due to people being away, **their service to be held today has been cancelled.**



St Alban. There were probably Christians in the British Isles already in the first century. However, Alban is the first recorded Christian martyr. The traditional date of his death is 304, during the persecution under the Emperor Diocletian; but many scholars now date it as around 209, during the persecution under the Emperor Septimius Severus. Alban was a pagan, and a soldier in the Roman Army. He gave shelter to a Christian priest who was fleeing from arrest, and in the next few days the two talked at length, and Alban became a Christian. When officers came in search of the priest, Alban met them, dressed in the priest's cloak, and they mistook him for the

priest and arrested him. He refused to renounce his new faith, and was beheaded. He thus became the first Christian martyr in Britain. The second was the executioner who was to kill him, but who heard his testimony and was so impressed that he became a Christian on the spot, and refused to kill Alban. The third was the priest, who when he learned that Alban had been arrested in his place, hurried to the court in the hope of saving Alban by turning himself in. The place of their deaths is near the site of St. Alban's Cathedral today. St Alban was the first British Christian martyr. His Feast Day is the 22nd June. He is the Patron Saint of converts, refugees and torture victims.

June Mission of the Month – The Mission to Seafarers

Time to get the knitting needles out!

The [Mission to Seafarers](#) is an international mission of the Anglican Church. MTS cares for the practical and spiritual welfare of seafarers of all nationalities and faiths. There are 230 Mission sites around the world. At the four centres in Victoria – Melbourne, Portland, Geelong and Hastings – work is carried out by a small number of staff, chaplains and volunteers who give freely of their time 365 days of the year. Each centre houses the 'Flying Angel Club' where seafarers are welcomed by a friendly face and can contact their families by phone or internet, and receive counselling during times of injustice or distress. The MtSV ship visiting program supports crew who do not receive shore leave and is a vital service to ensure these crew have the provisions and support they require. While most seafarers are well treated, some are still abandoned in ports far from their homes, or remain unpaid or forced to work in unsafe or unacceptable conditions. In such situations, the Mission plays a vital role in providing practical care and moral support.

Free Screening: Learning Together Doco + Cuppa, ‘The Warrigal Creek Massacre’ Documentary

As part of National Reconciliation Week activities, people across Gippsland are invited to attend a free screening of the 2018 documentary film, *The Warrigal Creek Massacre* to strengthen their understanding of this event that took place in Gippsland in 1843. With support from Director Lisa Gye, Gippsland Anglicans are proud to support greater awareness of the truth of settlement in our region, and to support reconciliation with First Nations peoples through respectful truth-telling and truth-hearing.

On Sunday 23rd June, seven Gippsland parishes are hosting a free screening of the 53-minute documentary, followed by a cuppa to allow people time to discuss the film and share their thoughts. The documentary is not available elsewhere.

The documentary film uses an interview format and explores historical documents to piece together the truth of a terrible crime committed against Gunaikurnai people in 1843 to which justice was never applied. There are no distressing scenes depicted, however violent acts are described at times.

Viewer discretion is advised and is not recommended for young children.

National Reconciliation Week is a time of education and growth for all Australians. It happens annually between 27th May and 3rd June.

The screening of *The Warrigal Creek Massacre* has been scheduled after these dates to provide a further opportunity for people to gather.
