# The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. *Luke 2.1-7*

#### Reflection:

Mary, mother of our Lord, is the supreme witness for us all to believe in God's promises. Only such faith could bear the extraordinary event of conception; the social stigma of baby conceived out of wedlock; the prophecy of a sword piercing her soul; of witnessing her son be both divine goodness and social madness; and the most painful blow of all, watching him die. Hail Mary, full of God's grace.

- Give thanks for the Church of Bangladesh, remembering especially today their ministry in a predominantly non-Christian context.

Stuart has had a long connection with Gippsland and particular in the area around Lakes Entrance where some of his extended family had/have property. I'm grateful to the Taplins for their willingness to hold things in my absence. While we have a wonderful ministry team, any one person leaves a gap - and I hope you'll all make Clem and Stuart warmly welcome in their time looking after the parish.

This week we farewelled Judy Tulip on Wednesday at a beautiful service led by Kate, followed by a burial at Sale Cemetery, and a sumptuous afternoon tea prepared by the CWA which was such an important part of Judy's life. We continue to pray for her family.

On Thursday we had a Greater Chapter meeting (in addition to Senior Staff and Bishop in Council... It was a big day!). This was a first for the new canons of the cathedral, Daniel Lowe, who is the senior chaplain at St Paul's School, and Jan Misiurka, who's part of Moe parish. The conversation was rich as we sought to define the roles and spaces of operation for Chapter and Greater Chapter. Chapter looks after the affairs of the parish; Greater Chapter, which consists of the archdeacons, the elected and appointed lay and clerical diocesan canons, and our own Lay Canons, the bishop, and the dean, has a focus on the Cathedral in the life of the diocese. We canvassed some exciting visionary possibilities for how this might be explored and developed further.

We welcome Bob Derrenbacker this weekend, eagerly looking forward to the Gospel of Mark seminar on Saturday afternoon (available online at some point thereafter), and to his preaching on Sunday at the cathedral. We'll also be celebrating Mary Mother of the Lord. We give thanks for Mary's prophetic voice and choice, and pray we may have grace to similarly say "yes" to God's call on our lives.

A couple of people asked for the prayer I shared at the end of my sermon last week. Here it is: "Jesus, I'm at your disposal today. Live in me as I live in you. May my hands be your hands, my feet your feet, my heart your heart for those around me. Amen."

# Mission of the Month: Anglicare Victoria

Four in every 10 families walking through the doors of Anglicare Victoria's emergency relief centres in the last 12 months were new faces that have never needed help before. More private renters and people with a regular income are being forced to seek help as they can't make ends meet. \$2.03m in food, medicine, clothes and other relief was delivered to people in need in 2023/24, more than double the \$874k pre-COVID for the 2019/20 period.
