Wisdom cries out in the street;

in the squares she raises her voice.

At the busiest corner she cries out;

A Reading from The Letter of James

But someone will say, 'You have faith and I have works.' Show me your faith without works, and I by my works will show you my faith. You believe that God is one; you do well. Even the demons believe—and shudder. Do you want to be shown, you senseless person, that faith without works is barren? Was not our ancestor Abraham justified by works when he offered his son Isaac on the altar? You see that faith was active along with his works, and faith was brought to completion by the works. Thus the scripture was fulfilled that says, 'Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness', and he was called the friend of God. You see that a person is justified by works and not by faith alone. Likewise, was not Rahab the prostitute also justified by works when she welcomed the messengers and sent them out by another road? For just as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is also dead. *James 2.18-26* Hear the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi; and on the way he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say that I am?' And they answered him, 'John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets.' He asked them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Peter answered him, 'You are the Messiah.' And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him. Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, 'Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.' He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life?

Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels.'

Dean's Doings

What a huge week this has been! Last Sunday I managed to squeeze the pedal harp into the car and went down to play in a fundraising concert at St Margaret's Eltham which raised over \$2000 for their music programme. It was lovely to see folk again, and great to see how the former scholarship students have continued to have a role in music there.

On Tuesday I attended the Provincial Council, hosted by the Archbishop at Holy Trinity East Melbourne (next door to Bishopscourt) - a gathering of clergy and lay reps from all five dioceses in our province of Victoria. We heard about the work Uncle Archdeacon Glenn Loughrey is doing in promoting truth telling and treaty and advocacy for First Nations people across the province, and we heard reports from each diocese, including our own. Interesting to note that two of the provincial registrars (including our Richard Connelly) are in the process of moving on... Thursday night was our regular Chapter meeting, and we were graced by the bishop's presence for our bible study and as he addressed us about a couple of matters. We also managed to establish a Hope25 subgroup of Chapter, we talked about the relationship between Greater Chapter and Chapter, about progress towards the 140th next month, about culture, about the many building and maintenance things that are in train (especially the replacement of the tiles on the chancel roof), and we gave approval for a faculty, as well as for starting a new ministry which I mentioned previously, a craft group.

Yesterday Rebecca Hayman and Damien King were ordained as priests in the church of God. There were about 185 people present - a huge task for our catering team. We congratulate Bec and Damien, and I offer my profound thanks and appreciation to our hardworking catering team!
