This week the bishop has been on leave, which has meant my focus has mostly been parish-based, spending time with a number of folk pastorally.

Kate presided at the annual National Police Remembrance Day service on Friday. This year saw the largest attendance of recent years, with about 90 folk coming to remember those police service personnel who have lost their lives in the line of duty. I attended the service and noted the warmth and fondness in how police

personnel responded to Kate - a testament to her faithful ministry in their midst as a police chaplain.

On Saturday, at the very time of the Grand Final, we ran a Safe Ministry workshop. My apologies for the timing, for those who need to do the training but felt the pull of "the other religion". We'll make sure there's another opportunity for a face to face session at some stage soon, and once the system is back up online, I'll reshare the link for those who wish to do the online training instead.

In a few weeks' time I'll be taking three weeks of leave, and in that time as I've mentioned before Clem and Stuart Taplin will be here as locums (and cat-sitting for me). 
